- Other –CT Ebert reported that she attended the ILMCT Conference from August 10th-14th. She also attended the LaPorte County Local Official Finance Company held on August 20th, 2025 regarding the SEA 1 Property Taxes.

Public Works

- Chuck Mack reported the following:
 - They have started the 2026 Community Crossings Grant process, the application deadline is due at the end of October due to the change in this process per Indot. They have established 8 roads to be paved at the new local match of 20%.
 - He contracted Midwest Water Resources for the Water Well retention program that was authorized last month. He worked with Sky Shelly to help identify the Well Field and to design the Emergency Plan that is due next Spring.
 - He is trying to identify the inflow that is getting into the well system as the pump cycles have dramatically increased.
 - O The Man Holes by Casey's which were cored on US #30, the repairs would be \$5,000-\$6,000 to have it done. Need to line those structures which would cost \$4,000 per structure totaling \$12,000 and including the \$6,000 it would total \$18,000-\$20,000. Chuck felt like the Town should not have to cover the cost of this and asked Attorney Shoffner if he thought we should have an Executive Session to discuss this further; Attorney Shoffner agreed. Motion by Councilman Howell; Second by Councilman Sutton to have this meeting on Thursday, September 11th, 2025 at 6:30 PM. CT Ebert stated that she would send out reminders to everyone and would put the Notice on our two doors.

New Business

- Clerk Treasurer Ebert gave the 1st reading of Ordinance 08-2025-2026 Budget.
- Motion by Councilman Howell; Second by Councilman Sutton to approve the Boring Application for Nipsco
- Motion by Councilman Howell; Second by Councilman Sutton to approve both Boring Applications for Frontier, Project #2510584 & 2510589 on a contingency that they get their Bond to the Town Hall.
